

**CLASSES OFFERED: 10th-12th grade**

<p><b>WORLD VIEWS (BIBLE 4)</b>          June 16-July 27 (6 weeks)          8:30 am-12:30 pm          10 credits          \$570.00 tuition + registration fee</p>	<p>This course meets the senior Bible requirement and covers the development of a Christian world view and its application to current issues facing Christians --- marriage and family, abortion, entertainment, and church-state matters. Recommended for honors and college prep students who need to make room in their schedule for other classes.</p>
<p><b>BIBLE MAKEUP</b>          June 16-July 6 (3 weeks)          8:30 am-12:30 pm          5 credits          \$285.00 tuition + registration fee</p>	<p>This course is for students who need to make up one semester of Bible 1, 2, or 3. The topics include a study of Proverbs and a comparative study of Christianity and the cults (e.g. Mormonism, Jehovah’s Witnesses, Christian Science, etc.)</p>
<p><b>LIT/COMP (Makeup)</b>          June 16-July 27 (6 weeks)          8:30 am-12:30 pm          5 credits each semester          \$285 tuition each semester          + registration fee</p>	<p><b>NOTE:</b>          First semester completed in first three weeks (June 16-July 6)          Second semester completed in second three weeks (July 7-27)</p> <p>This course is designed for those students who need to retake an English class for graduation, but do not desire to remain in the college prep curriculum. Your current English teacher or counselor must recommend you for this class.</p>
<p><b>ENGLISH 1</b>          June 16-July 27 (6 weeks)          8:30 am-12:30 pm          5 credits each semester          \$285 tuition each semester          + registration fee</p> <p><b>NOTE:</b> Each student will be charged a book fee. This class can only be taken by students who will be in 10th, 11th, or 12th grade next year.</p>	<p><b>NOTE:</b>          First semester completed in first three weeks (June 16-July 6)          Second semester completed in second three weeks (July 7-27)</p> <p>This course is for students who have taken ESL or English Prep Skills during their freshman year and wish to graduate with a college prep diploma. Students who are already in the college prep program and completed the first or second semester with a final grade of "D" or "F" will need to re-take this class. This course follows the college prep curriculum taught during the school year.</p>
<p><b>ENGLISH 2</b>          June 16-July 27 (6 weeks)          8:30 am-12:30 pm          5 credits each semester          \$285 tuition each semester          + registration fee</p> <p><b>NOTE:</b> Each student will be charged a book fee. This class can only be taken by students who will be in 11th or 12th grade next year.</p>	<p><b>NOTE:</b>          First semester completed in first three weeks (June 16-July 6)          Second semester completed in second three weeks (July 7-27)</p> <p>This course is for students wishing to meet the English requirements of the college prep diploma for original credit or makeup credit. Students who received a "D" or "F" in either the first or second semester will need to re-take this class. This course follows the college prep curriculum taught during the school year.</p>

<p><b>AMERICAN LITERATURE</b>  June 16-July 27 (6 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  5 credits each semester  \$285.00 tuition (each semester)  + registration fee  <b>NOTE:</b> Each student will be charged a book fee. This class can only be taken by students who will be in grade 12 next year.</p>	<p><b>NOTE:</b>  First semester completed in first three weeks (June 16-July 6)  Second semester completed in second three weeks (July 7-27)</p> <p>This course is for students wishing to meet the English requirements of the college prep diploma because the student received a "D" or "F" for the first and/or second semester or for 12<sup>th</sup> graders for original credit. This course follows the college prep curriculum taught during the school year.</p>
<p><b>ESL (English as a Second Language)</b>  June 16-July 27 (6 weeks)  <b>TIME: TBA</b>  10 credits  \$570.00 tuition + registration fee  <b>NOTE:</b> Each student will be charged a book fee.</p>	<p>This course is designed to encourage and facilitate use of the English language. Classroom time will include practice in listening, speaking, vocabulary, reading comprehension, and writing skills. Students will also study American culture, holidays, and traditions. Student placement will be confirmed by instructor.</p>
<p><b>PRE-ALGEBRA</b>  June 16-July 27 (6 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  10 credits  \$570.00 tuition + registration fee</p> <p>Each student will be charged a \$25 ALEKS lab fee.</p>	<p><b>NOTE:</b>  First semester completed June 16-July 6 (3 weeks)  Second semester completed July 7-July 27 (3 weeks)</p> <p>This course is for students who would like to proceed to Algebra 1 in the fall. By completing this course with a "C" or higher in the second semester a student has met the prerequisite for college prep Algebra 1.</p> <p>ALEKS is an online math learning tool.</p>
<p><b>ALGEBRA 1B</b>  July 7-27 (3 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  5 credits  \$285 tuition + registration fee</p>	<p><b>NOTE:</b>  Second semester completed July 7-27 (3 weeks)</p> <p>This course is designed for those students who have already taken Algebra 1 but earned low grades (D's or F's) in second semester or are part of a special class that needs to take Algebra 1B for original credit. Students who wish to take Geometry next year must have a "C-" or higher in the second semester of Algebra 1.</p>
<p><b>ALGEBRA 2B</b>  <b>(2<sup>nd</sup> semester only)</b>  July 7-27 (3 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  5 credits  \$285 tuition + registration fee  Note: Each student must have a graphing calculator.</p>	<p><b>NOTE:</b>  Second semester completed July 7-27 (3 weeks)</p> <p>This course is designed for those students who completed the second semester with a final grade of "D" or "F" and wish to move on to the next math level.</p>
<p><b>GEOMETRY</b>  <b>(original credit or make-up)</b>  June 16-July 27 (6 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  10 credits  \$570 tuition + registration fee  <b>NOTE:</b> Each student must have a graphing calculator.</p>	<p>This course is designed for those students entering 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade in the fall for original credit who have completed Algebra 1 with a C- or better.</p> <p>Students who received a "D" or "F" in either the first or second semester will need to re-take this class for make-up credit.</p>

<p><b>HONORS GEOMETRY</b>  June 16-July 27 (6 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  10 credits  \$570.00 tuition + registration fee  <b>NOTE:</b> Each student will be charged a book fee.</p>	<p>This course is for next year’s sophomores who were in a college prep math class last year but wish to move into the honors math track.</p>
<p><b>SPANISH 1B (make-up) (2<sup>nd</sup> semester only)</b>  July 7-27 (3 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  5 credits  \$285.00 tuition + registration fee</p>	<p>This course is designed for those students who completed the second semester with a final grade of “D” or “F” and wish to move on to Spanish 2 next school year.</p>
<p><b>SPANISH 2B (make-up) (2<sup>nd</sup> semester only)</b>  July 7-27 (3 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  5 credits  \$285.00 tuition + registration fee</p>	<p>This course is designed for those students who completed the second semester with a final grade of “D” or “F” who wish to meet the college prep diploma requirement.</p>
<p><b>HEALTH</b></p> <p>3 Choices: </p> <p>8:30 am-12:30 pm</p>	<p>This course is a semester survey of Health. During the course this class will focus upon your health and well-being, physical fitness, managing stress, body systems, medicines, drugs and diseases.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❶ June 16-July 6 (1<sup>st</sup> session; 3 weeks; 5 credits) \$285 + registration fee</li> <li>❷ July 7-27 (2<sup>nd</sup> session; 3 weeks; 5 credits) \$285 + registration fee</li> <li>❸ ON-LINE: (35 students maximum); June 16 – July 27 (6 weeks; 5 credits) \$335 total due</li> </ul>
<p><b>SPEECH</b>  June 16-July 6 (1<sup>st</sup> session – 3 weeks)  July 7-27 (2<sup>nd</sup> session – 3 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  5 credits  \$285.00 tuition + registration fee</p> <p><b>NOTE:</b> Class limit: 20 students</p>	<p>A one-semester speech class is required of every student. Communication, listening, and formal speech will be included in this class. Verbal and non-verbal communication, mass communication, small inter-personal group communication, and relational communication are areas of class discussion and study. Writing and organizing speeches, as well as instruction on delivery, prepares students for the practical experience of standing before the class delivering an impromptu, an expository, or a persuasive speech.</p>
<p><b>WORLD HISTORY I</b>  June 16 - July 27 (6 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  10 credits  \$570.00 tuition + registration fee</p>	<p>A basic survey of world civilizations from earliest times to the 16th Century, including the Ancient Greece, Rome, China and India, the Byzantine and Islamic Empires, Africa, the Middle Ages, the Renaissance, and the Reformation. Course content includes the political, philosophical, and cultural legacies of ancient Asian, African, and European civilizations, emphasizing both their independence and their interaction with one another.</p>
<p><b>WORLD HISTORY II</b>  June 16-July 27 (6 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  10 credits  \$570.00 tuition + registration fee</p>	<p>World History II is a sophomore level course in the Social Studies Program that earns 10 credits. Students in World History II study the history, religion, government and cultures of Modern civilizations, with an emphasis on the interactions and connections among regional civilizations. A distinctive feature of World History II at WCHS is an emphasis on the critical evaluation of historical narratives from an internal approach (strength of argument) and an external approach (worldview analysis).</p>

<p><b>U. S. HISTORY</b>  June 16-July 27 (6 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  10 credits  \$570.00 tuition + registration fee</p>	<p>This course is for college prep juniors who need to make room in their schedule for other classes during the school year. It is a study of American history from the colonial era to the present.</p>
<p><b>ECONOMICS</b>  Offered: June 16-July 6 (3 wks) <b>OR</b>  July 7-27 (3 wks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  5 credits  \$285.00 tuition + registration fee</p>	<p>This course is for college prep seniors who need to make room in their schedule for other classes. Seniors taking this class must take 5 classes during the school year (4 of these must be credit earning)</p>
<p><b>U.S. GOVERNMENT</b>  Offered: June 16-July 6 (3 wks) <b>OR</b>  July 7-27  8:30 am-12:30 pm  5 credits  \$285.00 tuition + registration fee</p>	<p>This course is for college prep seniors who need to make room in their schedule for other classes. Seniors taking this class must take 5 classes during the school year (4 of these must be credit earning)</p>
<p><b>BIOLOGY</b>  June 16-July 27 (6 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  10 credits  \$570.00 tuition + registration fee  <b>NOTE:</b> Each student will be charged a lab fee of \$25</p>	<p><b>NOTE:</b> First semester completed June 16-July 6 (3 weeks)  Second semester completed July 7-27 (3 weeks)</p> <p>This course fulfills a one year college prep lab science requirement and includes microscope work, lab drawings, chemical tests, dissections and laboratory observations.</p>
<p><b>COMPUTER APPLICATIONS</b>  June 16-July 27 (6 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  10 credits  \$570.00 tuition + registration fee   Class limit: 24 students each session</p>	<p>This course is an introduction to Microsoft Office 2007. Students will learn to be proficient in Word, Excel, Access and PowerPoint. They will be given a short overview of Adobe Photoshop. This course is also designed to prepare the students for the future by learning the keyboard by touch. Because this class moves so fast, it is recommended that students taking this in the summer can already type 30 wpm.</p>
<p><b>ART 1</b>  June 16-July 27 (6 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  10 credits  \$570.00 tuition + registration fee  <b>NOTE:</b> Each student will be charged a supply fee of \$75.00</p>	<p>Art 1 will provide an introduction to art history, demonstration, production and critique. There will be 2-3 projects per week ranging from pencil and charcoal to watercolor and pastel. A wide variety of styles will be explored including field trips to galleries and museums.</p>
<p><b>INTERMEDIATE DANCE</b>  June 16 – July 27 (6 weeks)  8:30 am-12:30 pm  10 credits  \$570.00 tuition + registration fee   <b>NOTE:</b> Each student is required to bring ballet &amp; jazz shoes &amp; workout clothes.</p>	<p>Intermediate Dance is meant for the student with previous years of dance experience. Students with little experience can attend. The objective of this course is to increase knowledge, technicality, and appreciation of dance through the study and exploration of selected dance forms. Jazz, ballet, modern, tap and commercial dance will be taught throughout the summer. Students will perform a show at the end of summer school. Along with increasing technical ability, dance history and cultural diversity among dance genres will be taught.</p>
